### **Announcement Board**

In February 2022, the Section on Professional and Organizational Development (SPOD) conducted a membership survey. The survey was distributed to the membership of the national chapter of ASPA. We aimed to learn about SPOD's general membership structure, member leadership activities, and future programming preferences. Twenty-four members completed the survey. The survey's findings are listed below:

- 87.5% of the respondents were current members, 6.25% were past members, and 6.25% were interested in membership
- Only 28.5% of the respondents said they were involved in SPOD activities and leadership
- 61.5% of the respondents said that they were interested in being contacted with leadership opportunities

Members stated that they wanted to see SPOD grow its membership and increase its social media activity. They added that they would like to see events with community agents, post-COVID transitions, and activities that promote diversity, inclusivity, and professional growth.

We are in the process of developing professional development programs and scholarships by using the survey's insightful findings.

Congratulations on a successful dissertation defense!

Richa's dissertation is a mixed-methods study of the use of social media platforms by arts and culture nonprofit organizations in the United States for fundraising, stakeholder engagement, and other organizational outcomes. She conducted three levels of analysis: a cross-sectional examination of the relationship between social media analytics and individual donations to organizations, an inductive, message-level analysis of the messaging of nonprofits, and qualitative interviews with communication managers.
