# Highlights of SPOD Accomplishments 2019-2021

The past two years have seen unprecedented change in activities and programs, particularly those related to public administration. These centered around continuing devolution of the extent of services, deterioration of economic, social, and racial conditions, disenfranchisement and instability of political processes, and closures of public spaces because of COVID-19. With the dawn of 2021, glimmers of hope emerged. Although the problems generating the conditions lie deeply embedded behind today's headlines, things are slowly taking different trajectories.

The Section for Professional and Organizational Development continued to promote positive change in the profession of public administration by fostering opportunities for career and personal growth. The biannual plan set forth goals to accomplish these through establishing networks and informal learning opportunities and providing support for individual achievement through scholarships and mentoring. Some key highlights for 2019-2021 include the following:

#### **RESOLUTION OF SECTION BANK ACCOUNT ACCESS**

The section bank account had a problem with a previous bank account that lacked authorized signature closeout. The issue was resolved in 2020 when an authorized SPOD leadership signature was accepted by Bank of America and a new account opened.

#### DIGITALIZATION OF PAQ

The board decided to convert the paper-based Public Administration Quarterly to a digital format September 20, 2020 to allow greater cost savings.

#### CALL FOR SYMPOSIA: HOW COVID-19 IS AFFECTING SOCIAL EQUITIES

The section announced a call for papers for a special edition of the Public Administration Quarterly on social inequities in institutions since the onset of Covid-19. The section reviewed four submissions, and two asked to revise and resubmit. All re-submissions were made by March 2021 with the announcement of the special edition to be made at a later date.

Initiation of New Newsletter and Website Activities.

#### INITIATION OF NEW NEWSLETTER AND WEBSITE ACTIVITIES

Zeeshan Noor, section Publications Chair, designed and developed a revitalized newspaper and website.

#### **CO-SPONSORED WEBINARS**

The section partnered with the ASPA Social Equity Diversity and Inclusion workshops to produce high-quality, online learning events: October 31, 2020 featured a discussion by Dr. Steven Putansu on performance management strategies in organizational mission and plans; Dr. Richard Greggory Johnson III showed how SEDI can be woven into learning curricula.




# MEET 2021 ANNUAL SPOD SCHOLARSHIP RECIPENTS
